However, to say of a lion that such a being is a bird is to misconceive what a lion is, which increases support for the notion that essence and existence are truly distinct in finite realities, since if they were not truly distinct, then to say of a lion that no such being exists would be to misconceive what that creature is (like saying a lion is a bird), but no misconception is happening on this account. Only a mistake pertaining to the existence-but not the essence-of lions, etc.

For Aristotle, existence is primary. For Plato, the world we perceive with our senses contains nothing except impermanent, ever-changing objects.

Actus Essendi is a Latin expression coined by Saint Thomas Aquinas. Translated as 'act of being', the expression actus essendi is a metaphysical principle outlined by Aquinas in his Christian reinterpretation of Aristotle. It relates to the essence of a thing, and how we as humans perceive this essence. He thought one could not perceive the essence of God as sense data but rather could only be understood in terms of His act of being, that is, His effects in the real world.

After distinguishing the two senses of 'being' (for an explanation of this distinction check my lecture-note 'Aquinas on Being and Essence'), and pointing out that it is only beings in the primary sense that have essence, since essence is precisely the determination of an act of being signified by the term 'being' in this sense, Aquinas goes on to show that the essence of a material substance itself has to contain matter somehow.

This summary contains the main points of Aquinas's ...

Primarily, for Aquinas, a thing cannot be unless it possesses an act of being, and the thing that possesses an act of being is thereby rendered an essence/existence composite. If an essence has an act of being, the act of being is limited by that essence whose act it is.

On Being and Essence, Ch. 4 (excerpt) Although substances of this kind (separate intelligences or angels) are simple forms without matter, nonetheless they are not in every way simple as pure acts are. They do have an admixture of potency, which is evident in the following way. Whatever is extraneous to the concept of an essence or quiddity comes to it from beyond itself, and forms a composition with the essence since no essence can be understood without those things which are its parts.
