Strategies for Teaching Sentence Structure - Video ...

The teacher rewrites important sections of text in short simple sentences in a step by step manner, defining relevant vocabulary to create an easier read. (¶Electrons have negative electric charges and orbit around the core, nucleus, of an atom.¶ Can be rewritten as, ¶Electrons have negative charges. They orbit around the center.

Step 1: Mini-Lesson on Sentences, Fragments, and Run-ons. Begin by explaining that complete sentences can be short or long, but they must have two basic parts, a subject and a predicate. The subject tells who or what the sentence is about, and the predicate is the action part of the sentence, or the part that tells what the subject is doing.

Teaching Kids How to Write Super Sentences

Sentence Errors. Once your students understand the basic parts of a sentence, they will have an easier time identifying fragments, run-on sentences, and rambling sentences. Fragments occur when a sentence lacks a subject or a verb or doesn't express a complete thought. Fragments are fixed by adding whatever is lacking.
