FRANCE-AND-THE-REMILITARIZATION

The Rhineland is a region in western Germany that borders Belgium, France, and a section of the Netherlands. The 1919 Treaty of Versailles and the 1925 Locarno Pact clearly stipulated that it was to be made into a demilitarized zone. Although Germany kept political control of the area, the nation was not permitted to have any type of military forces in the Rhineland.

The Locarno Treaties, signed in October 1925 by Germany, France, Italy and Britain, stated that the Rhineland should continue its demilitarized status permanently. Locarno was regarded as important as it was a voluntary German acceptance of the Rhineland's demilitarized status as opposed to the diktat (dictate) of Ver.
