The vast majority of motoring offences are governed by the Road Traffic Act 1988 and Schedule 2 to the Road Traffic Offenders Act 1988. It is the former that enshrines the offence into law and the latter that determines the penalty. There are 5 levels of fine which express the maximum amount that can be imposed and these are: Level 1 £ 200.00

Section 34(1) Road Traffic Offenders Act 1988. Where a driver is convicted or simply accepts that he is guilty of an offence he may be able to establish that there are Special Reasons why penalty points should not be endorsed on his licence. The same principle applies to offences that attract discretionary and mandatory periods of disqualification.

Road Traffic - Summary Offences | The Crown Prosecution ...
Section 1, Road Traffic Offenders Act 1988. For certain road traffic offences the driver must be given a warning that he faces prosecution. This is done by issuing a Notice of Intended Prosecution (NIP). Common offences requiring a NIP include: dangerous driving, careless driving, speeding and disobeying traffic signs and traffic signals.

A conviction under s.5 (1) (a) of the Road Traffic Act 1988 will result in an obligatory period of disqualification for a minimum period of 12 months. The court is also entitled to impose a prison sentence up to six months and a fine of £ 5,000. Statutory defence of post-incident drinking Section 15 of the Road Traffic Offenders Act 1988 provides:

For serious contraventions penalty points can be substituted for an instant ban.

Under s2 (3) Road Traffic Offenders Act 1988, an exception to the requirement to serve a notice of intended prosecution may apply if the police are unable to trace the registered keeper of the vehicle within sufficient time to serve it within 14 days.
