The dynasty ended with the capture of the last emperor in 1857 in Humayun's Tomb. The capital moved around Agra, Delhi and Lahore but in 1638 Shahjahan built himself a sovereign city in keeping with Asian cities of the time; Istanbul, Esfahan, Beijing and Edo (Tokyo). These were patrimonial states where the Emperor ruled as a Patriarch and used the metaphor of family to construct and control his city and empire.
