A Restorative conference involves asking a pupil or a group of pupils, questions that promote reflective thinking and allowing others the opportunity to listen and empathise. The goal is for the pupils to come to realisations themselves about why they behaved in the way they did and the consequences of it.

Building more effective supervision

One key aim of safeguarding restorative supervision is to mitigate the risk that safeguarding supervision becomes solely a management tool focused on task completion rather than a balanced process focused on supporting and enabling practitioners to use the critical thinking skills that are needed for safe practice.

Restorative approach Restorative approach/practice is a way that gives the victim (or those harmed) and opportunity to meet or communicate with those that have created the harm. Restorative practice can take many different forms from mediation, to shuttle mediation to a restorative meeting or an apology letter, one size does not fit all.
